# Principal's message:

### Dear Parents/Caregivers and whanau

We are now just half-way through the second 8-day cycle of learning at Masterton Intermediate and we are impressed by the way in which the vast majority of our students are responding very positively towards the many opportunities that are available to them. Our new students who arrived here on Tuesday, January 29 are already looking far more confident within the MIS surroundings.



The return of selection forms for the Education Outside the Classroom programme has been a little slower than hoped for with 62 students still to complete this task.

Groups will be finalised by Friday, February 22 and letters will be issued from each of our teachers to explain costs, organisation, and equipment required. There will also be a request for adult assistance with supervision. Your support with these activities would be much appreciated.

We endeavour to ensure that our school remains open for instruction from 8.45 am to 3.00 pm as regularly as possible throughout the school year. In Term One, there will be two exceptions on the following dates:

**Friday, March 8** in week six the school will be closed all day. Our staff will be involved in a First Aid training day with Red Cross.

**Tuesday, March 19** in week eight the school will close at 12.30 pm so that our three-way conferences with students, parents and teachers can start at 1.00 pm. These 20 minute conferences are very important to strengthen our partnership towards enabling your child to be the best that they can be. The other date for conferences will be on Wednesday, March 27 in week nine with the first time slot at 3.30 pm. In 2019 we are determined to achieve a 100% attendance at these conferences.
