At our recent Board of Trustees meeting on Tuesday, February 26, a number of decisions were presented, discussed or confirmed:

- To purchase a gazebo to provide cover and storage for sports teams representing our school
- To start a pilot programme in term two to assist a group students with anxiety issues to work with Wendy Haust, a psychologist based in Masterton
- To accept the offer to be a pilot school starting in 2020 in the KiVa programme • which is designed to minimise the frequency of bullying in schools
- To install four more picnic tables to provide additional learning spaces outside the classroom for our students
- To purchase a new set of mathematics text books
- To continue the process towards the implementation of an enrolment scheme to ensure that our class sizes will • not exceed 32 students in the future
- To present a school production, "Disney: Lion King Junior" in term three with performances in our school hall on • the evenings of Tuesday, September 16 and Thursday, September 18. We have not had an MIS production for many years.
- To revise our system of reporting to parents about the progress of their child. We will be providing surveys to families to ascertain what you want us to prioritise in terms of what we report to you about and will also do the same for our students.
- To have stage three of our adventure playground completed by the end of the 2019 school year.

New Boards of Trustees will be elected in all New Zealand schools on June 7 this year and I ask you to please consider standing for one of these roles here at MIS. We are looking for five parent representatives to govern our school from June this year until June, 2022. Eight meetings are held each year, usually on the last Monday or Tuesday evening of each month. You are most welcome to contact me to discuss the position of a BOT member if you would like more information.

The timeline of dates for this process is as follows.

- Nominations close on Friday, May 24, 2019 •
- Voting papers will be sent by Wednesday, May 29, 2019 .
- Election date is June 7, 2019
- New Board of Trustees takes office on June 14, 2019

A reminder that the school will be closed for instruction next Friday, March 8 to allow our staff to update their First Aid Certificates.

We will also be closing the school from 12.30 pm on the afternoon of Tuesday, March 19 in order to start the threeway conferences with students, parents and class teachers which will run from 1.00 pm to 8.30 pm.
